There are minor spellings and grammatical errors; the author is advised to send the manuscript for proofreading.</p> <p>1) Line 12: Inappropriate word; Faecal samples were aseptically collected???</p> <p>2) Line 29-32: These statements are unnecessary: Helminthes also known as parasitic worms, they are large macroparasites characterised by elongated, flat or round bodies (Castro, 1996). Protozoan parasites are microscopic, one-celled organisms that are only able to multiply in the human body (Haque, 2007).</p> <p>4) Line 124: Administrative Clearance change to Ethical Clearance</p> <p>3) Line 241-245: These two statements are confusing, please rephrase;</p> <p>"The high prevalence of human gastrointestinal parasitic infections in this study is unconnected with the fact that the socio-economic and environmental conditions of the IDPs enhance transmission of the parasitic agents".</p> <p>"This report is a strong indicator that faecal contamination is prevalent in the camp environment due to poor sanitation and improper waste disposal".</p>
