<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>This article needs to be reviewed by a native English speaker as there are grammatical errors throughout.</p> <p>The methods section needs to be flushed out to provide a clear understanding of how the materials were collected, what screening criteria were used, and what, if any, validation was applied to ensure their veracity.</p> <p>There is a wonderful richness of information in this paper that I think is beautifully constructed. However, the conclusion needs a lot of work to bring all of that work into a cohesive synthesis. Right now, it reads very jumbled and lacks a structure that is memorable and clearly derived from the comprehensive review.</p>	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	<p>The goal of the paper should be listed in the Introduction section, not the methods.</p> <p>I suggest outlining the categories and structure in the methods section so that the reader knows what to expect in the results/discussion.</p> <p>The Economic Impact and Industrial sector sections are missing some connection to health and health outcomes. Clearly, they are related. But the article would benefit from some discussion of *how* they are related and *why* the COVID related changes are likely to impact mental and physical health.</p> <p>I don't think Figure 1 adds to the understanding of the economic impact, unless it were to show the likely changes due to COVID.</p> <p>I believe Figure 2 would be more impactful with adjusted rates or percentages.</p>
