<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The English language and grammar need thorough revision. Eg. In introduction – “It is a <b>relatively</b> benign..... (What do they mean by relatively benign? They can simple say “benign”. Some places sentences appear too long like - “It’s etiology is poorly understood, and to our knowledge, it’s incidence rates have not been reported, although it is known to be much more prevalent in Asian populations”. The authors have to do a thorough spell check as there are spelling mistakes like – “metastasic”, “hepatosplenomegaly” etc.</li> <li>2. <b>In the abstract the authors can indicate briefly about their case and its importance and why they think it to be reported.</b></li> <li>3. <b>In the text they have mentioned about 3 figures, but only 2 figures are there. The figure 1 is hazy, a better figure will be useful with clarity. The figures can be elaborated for better understanding of its depiction. The addition of IHC figures will be more useful.</b></li> <li>4. <b>The discussion needs to be elaborated with a more detail review of available literature. Giving a comparison and contrast of the current case can be more useful.</b></li> </ol>	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>In the introduction they have mentioned</b> “to our knowledge,....” The authors can quote by thoroughly reviewing available English literature / Pubmed search and giving appropriate reference.</li> <li>2. The authors can mention the patient ethnical &amp; geographical background.</li> <li>3. The authors can mention the drug or treatment history before presenting to the current institution.</li> <li>4. What are the chest X ray findings to suggest hilar lymphadenopathy likely of infective origin.</li> <li>5. Is there any CBC abnormality? What were the counts? Have they done any biochemical tests like LDH? Have they done any autoimmune work up? A complete hematological, biochemical and immunological picture especially relevant positive and negative findings can be added.</li> <li>6. <b>It’s very difficult to distinguish plasmacytoid dendritic cells by H&amp;E but can be recognized with IHC. The authors can clarify about it as they have mentioned about it while describing the H&amp;E findings. Similarly the proportion of T &amp; B cells will be of interesting as usually the T cells, especially CD8+ cells predominate in the involved zone and B cells are few.</b></li> <li>7. Are both lymph nodes showing similar findings? Do they have found late changes like xanthomatous change as the patient was symptomatic for 4 months.</li> <li>8. Can mention whether neutrophils and eosinophils are absent in their case.</li> </ol>
