Compulsory REVISION comments	<p>I would suggest the reviewers to take a look at grammar and style of writing. Several errors in writing were noted through out the manuscript and the writing style is a bit confusing. The case report could be a little more detailed with physical exam. Was there any orthostatic BP obtained? Any difference between right and left upper extremity blood pressures? Any labs obtained besides troponin (electrolytes, glucose)? These are important components of a syncope evaluation and would let the reader know that a systemic approach was used to identify the etiology.</p> <p>Statements like sudden cardiac death does not occur in children less than 10 and adults > 30 is confusing and factually inaccurate.
